Incident Termination Activities

Once the fire has been struck, many “demobilization” tasks need to be accomplished. Scene and personnel safety is still a critical task and can be taken for granted as the incident starts to stabilize. Many injuries and some fatalities have occurred at the incident well after the fire has been struck and the potential for long-term exposures and hazards still remain. Discuss how your department addresses these “end-of-operation” tasks according to your SOP's or agency best practices.
