Primary RIC Duties

Background: Primary tasks for RIC will revolve around the type of strategy that is being implemented at the incident. At defense operations, RIC functions might be reduced to stand-by modes while at offensive operations, RIC will have significant duties that have to be performed often very quickly. Each situation is different, so an effective size-up is necessary to identify the priority of the tasks to be performed. Use the following lists to lead a discussion among your crews on the primary RIC duties at sample incidents. **Outline how these tasks are to be completed and what factors you consider when making RIC action plans.** Review your crew tool assignments and department policies for size-up and functions of the RIC.

Primary Tasks for Rapid Intervention Crews

- 1. Obtain briefing from IC or other officers/crews operating at incident.**
- 2. Prepare to or Respond to any MAYDAY call.**
- 3. Assess the need for ground ladders or other access limited areas.**
- 4. Assemble and maintain RIT equipment at entry point location.**
- 5. Monitor radio and maintain contact with IC, report actions and needs through IC.**
- 6. Assess where crews are working and assignment and determine those in highest hazard area.**
- 7. Obtain status reports from Operations and Incident Safety Officer.**
- 8. Develop Incident Action Plan for potential rescue operations.**
- 9. Monitor progress of crews on their tasks / assignments.**
- 10. Rotate or relieve RIC as required by incident duration and mobilization.**
